

Quick Reference for Symptoms: When to Call Your Healthcare Team

Change in alertness	 Unconscious Unable to arouse or wake up Seizure 	 New or increased confusion Change in level of alertness Sudden change in vision Falling down with injury Numbness, tingling or loss of movement in limbs Severe dizziness 	 Major mood changes Unable to sleep Lethargic Change in energy level Tremors/shakiness Not able to get around Headaches
Bleeding	 Uncontrolled bleeding 	 New or increased bleeding Bloody urine Unable to stop nosebleed Bloody bowel movements Vomiting of blood One or more feminine pad per hour is used 	 Frequent controlled nose bleeds New easy bruising Little red or purple spots on the skin (especially hands and feet) Bleeding from gums
Change in breathing	 No breathing Choking 	 Trouble breathing Feeling as if can't get enough air Trouble breathing when laying flat Wheezing with breaths Persistent continuous cough Coughing blood or green/yellow material 	 Becomes short of breath more easily with little activity New or recurrent cough

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Constipation		 Constipation with hard, tender, bloated belly, and /or nausea/vomiting 	 Painful or trouble passing of stools that are hard, dry, or small in volume No bowel movement for 3 or more days or change from baseline
Diarrhea		 Constant or uncontrolled diarrhea (> 10 times/day) Diarrhea more than 12 hours while on medicine to stop it Diarrhea with fever or belly cramping Stool which is bloody, burgundy or black Signs of dehydration (excessive thirst, heart palpitations, dizziness, dark-looking urine or less urine) 	 Mild belly cramping New onset diarrhea Whole pills passed in stool Diarrhea greater than 3 times/day
Fatigue	 Unable to wake up 	 Dizziness Too tired to get out of bed or walk to the bathroom 	 Fatigue is getting worse Staying in bed all day Other symptoms occur with increased fatigue
Infection	 Lethargic, difficult to arouse 	 Temperature 100.4 °F or above Shaking chills (temperature may be normal) Signs/symptoms of infection such as: Loose bowel movement(s) Frequent urination with or without burning or discomfort New cough, sore throat, mouth/lip sores New earaches, headaches, stiff neck 	 New redness or swelling on skin or at IV site Cold symptoms New abdominal or back pain Toothache Cuts that become red/swollen Unusual vaginal discharge or itching Sinus pain or pressure

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Mouth sores or sores in throat (mucositis or stomatitis)	 Unable to breathe 	 Trouble breathing Cannot swallow Choking Bright red blood in mouth Pain not controlled by medicine 	 White patches or sores appear on gums or mouth Trouble swallowing food or fluid
Nausea/ vomiting		 Uncontrolled, constant nausea or vomiting Blood or "coffee ground" appearing material in vomit Medicine not kept down because of vomiting Weakness or dizziness along with nausea/vomiting Severe belly pain while vomiting Projectile vomiting (vomit shoots out for a distance) 	 Nausea persists without control from anti-nausea medicine Unable to take medicine due to nausea
Pain	 Severe chest or arm pain Severe squeezing or pressure in chest 	 New or uncontrolled pain Headaches not relieved with acetaminophen Chest discomfort with pounding heart Burning in chest or stomach 	 Sores or painful areas on skin or mouth New pains not relieved with pain medicine Painful port-a-cath, Hickman, or PICC site or surrounding area Pain with infusion of medicine or fluids into port-a-cath, Hickman, or PICC
Rash		 Sudden onset body rash Rash with severe pain or itching Rash with blistering or peeling of skin 	 New or changes in skin rash Redness and/or tenderness on palms or soles of feet

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Swelling		 Sudden swelling with or without pain 	 Swollen legs, hands Swelling around port-a- cath, Hickman, or PICC
Urination		 Unable to urinate for more than 8 hours Blood in urine Painful urination 	 Strong odor of urine Change in color of urine
