RADIATION ONCOLOGY

Radiation oncology is a specialty focusing on the use of radiation therapy to safely and effectively treat or control cancer and relieve symptoms. Radiation therapy is often used along with other treatment methods like chemotherapy or surgery.

MEDICAL ONCOLOGY

Hematology is the specialty of internal medicine that involves treating conditions of the blood, bone marrow, and lymphatic system such as leukemia, Hodgkin's disease, multiple myeloma, lymphoma, and coagulation disorders such as hemophilia. Oncology refers to the study and treatment of cancer. At Logan Health Hematology & Oncology, our healthcare teams—with extensive training in medical oncology and hematology—evaluate, educate, and treat patients with cancer and blood disorders using medicines.

INFUSION

Infusion refers to treatments that are delivered through a needle or tube inserted into a vein (also called IV treatment). Infusion treatments include cancer chemotherapy and immunotherapy, as well as non-cancer treatments like hydration, antibiotics, iron, and blood transfusions. Infusion therapy also includes other non-oral routes (by mouth) such as injections into the muscle or skin, putting medicine into the membranes around the spinal cord, or in the bladder.

Our nurses are nationally certified in infusion and oncology with specialized training in chemotherapy, immunotherapy, infusion therapy, vascular access devices, and advanced skills in adult and pediatric cardiac life support. They will ensure you will have a pleasant experience; light snacks and beverages, warm blankets, personal TVs and reading materials will be offered.

PALLIATIVE MEDICINE

Palliative medicine - also called supportive care or palliative care - focuses on providing patients with relief from the symptoms, pain, and stress of a serious illness. The goal of palliative care is to improve the quality of life for patients and their families with a patient and family-centered approach. Anyone with a serious or life-limiting illness may receive palliative care. There are no age limits, specific diagnoses, or life expectancy requirements. Palliative medicine compliments any disease-directed treatments that patients may choose and is not meant to replace primary or specialty providers.

GENETICS & GENOMICS



Some genetic changes have been associated with an increased risk of having a child with a birth defect or developmental disability or developing diseases such as cancer or heart disease. Genetics also can help us understand how medical conditions happen.

Lymphedema Therapy: Our lymphedema therapy program is led by a certified lymphedema therapist. This program educates patients about lymphedema therapy and provides decongestive therapy in order to improve patients' limb functions.

Physical Therapy: Our skilled physical therapists will work with you to improve mobility, reduce pain, and enhance independence and quality of life. We focus on treatment and improvement, helping individuals achieve independence from physical therapy – instead of dependence on physical therapy. We focus on the unique issues that are of concern to each patient in order to achieve optimal outcomes and regain normal function.

Occupational Therapy: Our Logan Health Occupational Therapists evaluate and treat patients with a wide array of concerns. These can include bone and joint conditions, recovery after operations, and conditions caused by injuries.

Speech Therapy: Logan Health offers both adult and pediatric speech-language pathology or speech therapy. Speech problems often occur because a person has difficulty producing sounds due to the incorrect movement of the muscles in the lips, tongue, and mouth. Our skilled speech-language pathologists develop individualized treatment plans for our patients, guiding them through communication techniques, and strategies for coping with speech/language barriers.




